



Tarot Teacher Answers Frequently Asked Questions about the Cards By Cheryl Hill

The tarot reveals the seen and unseen aspects of our lives, but ironically, the cards don't answer these FAQ's:

1. What are the more important benefits of learning the tarot?

-Gain more understanding of yourself and others.

-Glean immediate answers to your questions.

-Perform professional readings.

-Develop your own psychic strength.

2. Is there a right or wrong tarot deck?

No. When the seeker is "drawn" to a particular deck of cards, then they should use their intuitive sense to choose.

3. Once I obtain the cards, should I do something special with them?

The first course of action is to place your energy on each card by handling them one by one. Then, go back through the deck and see which particular cards you are drawn to. Look up the meaning of the cards. See how you feel about the description and, if you feel something different, write down the meaning. When you are finished have ready a silk pouch, a silk cloth, or a special box to store your cards inside.

4. How does using the tarot cards in a reading assist the reader?

After a question is asked, by laying out the cards, the reader can gain a better perspective on his or her client's problem and help the querent understand themselves and their situation more clearly.

5. How can I give an accurate reading if I'm reading over a phone call or internet chat? Doesn't the person I'm reading for have to be in my presence?

Not at all. The reader's intuition is not bound by space. Haven't you or someone you've known, had a sudden feeling about a person not in their immediate physical zone? This type of knowing happens all the time. The person receiving the feeling is "connected" somehow to the other person, whether they are related, friends, or lovers. When a reader does a reading, they connect to the querent by either the phone line or computer. In fact, some readers prefer not to be face to face with the querent because that person may not knowingly influence the reading by their body language or reactions.

6. Regarding intuition - if we're all psychic, then why do I even need to learn to read the tarot cards?

There is a difference between being intuitive and psychic. Everyone has intuition - that "gut" feeling one gets when something is about to happen. But, when you use the tarot you will find that you will be developing your intuition to a more fine-tuned vibration. That's what being psychic is - the reader is more precise and the predictions are based on what may be seen, heard, or felt, instead of a "hunch".
